The final version of the 1990 World Values survey is attached. It is important that data from all countries be coded in exactly the same format, to facilitate comparative analysis. For this reason, please code your data in card-image format (even though most data will be sent on magnetic tape) according to the format indicated on this questionnaire.

There are seven cards for each respondent, with the first 10 columns of each card being used for the following identification variables:

Columns 1-3:	Survey number (a constant, "904")
Column 4:	Card number (for first card, "1", for second card, "2," etc.)
Columns 5-6:	Country code (a separate 2-digit code for each country; see below)
Columns 7-10:	Interview number (assign a unique interview number to each person)

Columns 11-15 are normally left blank, so that the response to the first question is coded on card 1, column 16 (indicated as position 116 on the attached questionnaire). Thus the first card image contains the data from questions 116 through 180, and the second card image contains the data from questions 216-279. The country codes are as follows:

The specific parties should fit the given society.

In non-Western countries, it is possible to omit the following questions if it seems necessary:

Questions 131 - 180 (volunteer activities)

Questions 324 - 330 (what makes life meaningful)

Questions 424 - 436 (factors in successful marriage)

If anything is omitted, be sure to leave blanks in the corresponding data space, so that the rest of your data will be in the same format as that of other countries.

The basic sample of 1,000 interviews must be representative of the population 18 and over; this means that the following characteristics must correspond exactly to their representation in the universe:

- Sex
- Age groups
- Education
- Occupation and occupational groups
- Regional distribution
- Size of respondent's town or city.

In the meetings of the Steering Committee and the Working Group, it was agreed that both random and quota samples would be accepted. In choosing a sampling method, the method applied in the first study should also be taken into consideration without, however, this earlier decision predetermining the current choice.

Fieldwork

The fieldwork should be conducted in all countries in spring 1990, between March and late May if possible. We ask any country not able to conduct the fieldwork within this time period to please let us know.

The field organization conducting the work should be experienced in performing representative quantitative surveys. Each interviewer should ideally conduct only a small number of interviews; we recommend 3 to 5. If the field capacity is too small and each interviewer must conduct a greater number of interviews, this number should not exceed ten.

The complexity of the survey requires that the interviewers be given an extensive briefing. The briefing must, of course, be tailored to the needs of each individual interviewer organization. The fact that experience with complex studies in the social sciences, lengthy interviews and certain types of questions varies must be reflected in the instructions to the interviewers.

Listed below are specific points which we feel should be included in all briefings:

Interviewer Instructions

All questions in the questionnaires must be read exactly as they stand. The questions asked in the interview must not deviate from the questions in the questionnaire. The sequence of the questions must also be followed exactly.

The response "Don't know" should, in general, not be read out loud. And the "Don't Know" option should not be printed on the Show Cards.

There are several questions where the responses are read out in reverse order in every other interview, for example Question 130. In the first interview the alternatives are read out in the order 1,2,3,4 and in the second interview in the order 4,3,2,1. It should be pointed out that the DK category is never read out loud in these questions either.

Part of the questions do not apply to all respondents but only to subgroups. This applies to questions:

- 167 to 180: This question is only asked of respondents who have done volunteer work in at least one of the volunteer organizations or activities listed, that is have responded affirmatively at least once on questions 149 to 166a-p
- 265 to 269: Only for jobholders
- 333: This question is only for respondents belonging to a religious denomination
- 334: This question is only for respondents who do not/no longer belong to a religious denomination; and thus who answered "no" on Question 332

- 374 to 380: This question is only for respondents who are married, unmarried but living together, divorced, widowed or separated; all those who checked off one of the responses between 1 and 5 on Question 372
- 438: Only for respondents with children
- 678/679: Only for those who answered "Don't know" once or both times when asked about their voting intentions (674 to 677)

If Questions 516 to 529 are not clear, the interviewer should explain the questions' design: "If you are totally in agreement with the statement on the left side, you choose 1; if you are totally in agreement with the statement on the right side, you choose 10. You can nuance your answer by selecting a number in between."

Regarding the demographics: The year of birth is sufficient for Question 717/718.

Regarding the interviewer's observations in Questions 733ff: The interviewer instructions should state again that these questions must be filled out by the interviewer alone without any further information from the respondent. The interviewer should note the time at the beginning and end of the interview to provide accurate information on the length of the interview for 738/740.

*

Before the questionnaires are printed and sent to the interviewers they should be checked again carefully to ensure that the coding corresponds exactly to the original English version.

Filling out the respondent's address at the end of the questionnaire is discretionary: it is up to each national research group or field organization to decide whether they record the addresses or not.

The code points 744-745 (double digit) are reserved for the region. Please state the coding you have used for this.

Please check again carefully to make sure that all nation-specific questions have been correctly adapted to your individual country. To facilitate your check, we have once again listed below the nation-specific questions:

In Question 277, for example, the response "20 pounds" must be replaced by the equivalent sum in your national currency, in Questions 712 through 715 the political party lists must be modified appropriately and in Questions 731/732 the income categories must be adapted to the income structure in your own country.

Data Processing

We have enclosed the first version of the codebook to facilitate data processing. A second, expanded version of the codebook along with the international data tape will be available following completion of the study. This second, expanded codebook will include the response categories in each country for all nation-specific questions as well as the corresponding codes.

Please follow the enclosed cleaning instructions and let us know if you are sending us an uncleaned data tape; we will then clean the tape here.

If you plan on weighting your data, this should not exceed 3 digits and should be entered on card 7, columns 77-79.

Please send us the data tape in the following form:

- 800 BPI, 1600 BPI or 6250 BPI (preferably 1600 BPI)
- Unlabeled
- EBCDIC or ASCII

When you send us the data tape please include:

- a hole count
- one copy of your questionnaire and a set of cards shown to respondents
- one copy of your interviewer instructions
- a list of your codes for the nation-specific questions
- data on the fieldwork (beginning and concluding dates of fieldwork, number of interviewers, number of sampling points)

It is important that you keep either the original data tape or a copy in case the shipment is lost in the mail.
