The PGSW (Polskie Generalne Studium Wyborcze) is aimed - among other objectives - at joining the international community of National Election Studies. The idea emerged and was widely discussed in Poland at the end of 1994, and was finally accepted by the Polish National Science Foundation (Komitet Bada Naukowych) in 1997 and 2001. The initiative was affiliated with the Institute of Political Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences. The first wave of the project and its financial support was granted exclusively by the Polish National Science Foundation. The duration of the project was from 1997 to 1999 and covered the 1997 parliamentary election only. The objective of the initial phase of PGSW was to: conduct the survey, create readable data files and codebooks (both in Polish and English) and publish first results in a book-form. The second wave of the project and its financial support was granted by the Polish National Science Foundation, also supported by Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) and Warsaw School of Social Psychology (SWPS). The duration of the project was from 2001-2003 and covered the 2001 parliamentary election only. Substantial part of the PGSW questionnaire is reserved for the CSES module. The 1997 PGSW survey included its full-blown Module I version, and the 2001 PGSW survey - Module II version. The funding for 2000 survey came from a grant awarded to Dr. Krzysztof Jasiewicz, Professor of Sociology at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia, USA, and Research Associate at the ISP PAN by the National Council for Eurasian and East European Research, under the authority of a Title VIII grant from the U.S. Department of State.

The Polish National Election Study (Polskie Generalne Studium Wyborcze) covers: 1) analysis of the social and political awareness of Poles, rendered with an intensified public opinion poll conducted among a big number of participants (questionnaire research); 2) Polish parliamentary elites analysis - both their socio-demographic, as well as - mainly - their attitudes and political views 3) party manifesto research, and 4) so called, political ecology - research of regional political and electoral differences. PGSW comprises among others a comparative part; so called CSES module (Comparative Study of Electoral Systems) covering about 50 political systems of the countries of all continents.
