Dear participant:

The Carleton University Survey Centre, a research unit at Canada's capital university, has chosen your name at random to participate in a vital international project; a worldwide survey on the subject of the Family. This project is called the International Social Survey Programme. Carleton University is a member of this non-profit academic organization, which extends to over 45 countries, and we conduct the Canadian component of this survey every year.
