

## Jena Study of Social Change and Human Development (Adults): ZA5578, ZA5593, ZA5594

The Jena Study of Social Change and Human Development (Adults) is a longitudinal project started 2005 with a large cross-sectional survey (ZA4741/ZA4749). In 2007, 2008, and 2009 longitudinal follow-ups with smaller subsamples have been conducted (ZA5578, ZA5593, ZA5594).

The **full version** of the first wave (2005) and the three follow-ups (2007-2009) include variables containing sensitive data, e.g. small regional classification (district code) and detailed biographic information like occupation and specific family context among other.

Usage of this data is subject to special contractual regulations. Due to the data's sensitive nature, special restrictions apply, and the data can only be analyzed on-site at the Secure Data Center (SDC) in Cologne. You can find more information and contact details on our web pages:
