The ISSP is a cross-national collaboration program, which has been continuously conducting annual surveys on diverse social science topics since 1985. The topics for each ISSP survey are proposed by delegates from ISSP member countries. Then, a Basic Questionnaire is composed by a committee, elected by the General Assembly before it is pretested in various countries. Starting in 1984 with four founding nations - Australia, Germany, Great Britain and the United States, the ISSP meanwhile has grown up to almost 50 member countries covering various cultures around the globe.

## 2.2 Content

### 2.2.1 Abstract

The International Social Survey Programme (ISSP) is a continuous programme of cross-national collaboration running annual surveys on topics important for the social sciences. The programme started in 1984 with four founding members - Australia, Germany, Great Britain, and the United States – and has now grown to almost 50 member countries from all over the world. As the surveys are designed for replication, they can be used for both, cross-national and cross-time comparisons. Each ISSP module focuses on a specific topic, which is repeated in regular time intervals. Please, consult the documentation for details on how the national ISSP surveys are fielded. The present study focuses on questions about Role of Government: political attitudes and the role of government.

The release of the cumulated ISSP ‘Role of Government’ modules for the years 1985, 1990, 1996, 2006 and 2016 consists of two separate datasets: ZA4747 *Role of Government I-V* and ZA4748 *Role of Government I-V Add On*. ZA4747 contains all the cumulated variables, while the supplementary data file ZA4748 contains all those

variables that could not be cumulated for various reasons. The two data sets can be matched easily if necessary.

#### **ZA4747 – Topics:**

Attitudes to compliance with law; attitudes to various forms of protest against the government; views regarding freedom of speech for extremists; attitudes to police intervention in the private sphere to prevent crimes; attitudes to justice error; perceived threat to the private sphere from governmental data collection and computer networks (privacy protection); tax fairness, attitudes to government measures regarding control of wages, redistribution of wealth, salaries and prices; attitudes towards state intervention in the economy; attitudes to increased government spending for environmental protection, public health system, the police, education system, defence, pensions, unemployment benefits, culture and arts; priority for fighting inflation or fighting unemployment; evaluation of the influence of trade unions, industry and government; evaluation of the government's position in electricity supply, the steel industry as well as banking and insurance; attitudes to welfare state and responsibility for jobs, price control, health care, decent standard of living, economic growth, reduction of income differences, support for students, housing supply and protection of environment; political interest; political efficacy; trust in politicians and civil servants; assessment of tax equity with various income groups; in the case of terror suspect the government should have the right to detain people, to tap people's telephone conversations, to stop and search people in the street at random; assessment about how many politicians in the country are involved in corruption; rating about how many public officials in the country are involved in corruption; how often public officials wanted a bribe in last 5 years; success of the country's government in the following areas: providing health care for the sick, providing a decent standard of living for the old, dealing with threats to the country's security.

### 3 Dataset structure and standards

ISSP *Role of Government I-V* cumulates the data of the integrated data files of

- ISSP 1985 (ZA1490 Data file Version 1.0.0, <https://doi.org/10.4232/1.1490>),
- ISSP 1990 (ZA1950 Data file Version 1.0.0, <https://doi.org/10.4232/1.1950>),
- ISSP 1996 (ZA2900 Data file Version 1.0.0, <https://doi.org/10.4232/1.2900>),
- ISSP 2006 (ZA4700 Data file Version 2.0.0, <https://doi.org/10.4232/1.13707>) and
- ISSP 2016 (ZA6900 Data file Version 2.0.0, <https://doi.org/10.4232/1.13052>).

It comprises data from all ISSP member countries that participated in at least two Role of Government modules (31 countries, comp. *Table 3.1*). The data release consists of two separate data files. The main file, ZA4747 *Role of Government I-V*, contains only cumulated variables. That means it includes:

- topic-related variables of the master questionnaires, called module variables, which appear in at least two Role of Government modules and
- background variables, mostly covering demographics, which appear in at least two Role of Government modules

However, there are other, mainly country-specific background variables, which belong to the ISSP standard, but cannot be cumulated for various reasons. Although not being comparative over time, these variables might still be useful for many analyses. Therefore, they are included in a second data file with the study number ZA4748 *Role of Government I-V Add On*. The variables contained can be matched easily to the cumulated file if necessary.

#### 3.1 Countries

Overall, the cumulated datasets contain data from 31 countries. *Table 3.1* shows all the countries and the years in which each country participated. Also contained are the different country codes provided in the dataset (c\_alphan and country). In some cases, it is important to identify subsamples within a country sample (comp. c\_sample). This pertains to three countries: Germany, Israel and the United Kingdom. Both the German and Israeli surveys oversample parts of their respective populations: East Germans in the case of Germany and Israeli Arabs in the case of Israel. Consequently, analyses of the German and Israeli data at country-level are not representative of their respective populations unless they are properly weighted. Design weights to adjust for the overrepresentation of one part of the population are available for most but not all modules (comp. variable weights). For the United Kingdom, there are independent surveys for Great Britain and Northern Ireland. Please note that, currently, the data from these two surveys cannot be integrated to form a representative sample of the United Kingdom, because weighting factors to adjust the populations sizes are not available.

### 3.4 Data preparation

#### 3.4.1 Archive variables and identification variables

All archive variables have been coded according to the standards applicable at the date of publication.

- The data in studyno, version and doi has been updated to identify the datasets at hand.
- The variables cumu\_id, year\_sdno and c\_sample\_year have been newly coded for the cumulated dataset.
- The country codes in country, c\_alphan and c\_sample have been updated to ISO 3166 for ZA1490 (1985), ZA1950 (1990) and ZA2900 (1996)

#### 3.4.2 Harmonization of module variables

For the module variables only the coding of missing values needed to be harmonized. Please see section 3.5. for the missing value coding scheme.

#### 3.4.3 Harmonization of background variables

The standards for background variables used in the five cross-section surveys cumulated in this dataset have changed considerably over time. Up until the 2006 survey, the repertoire of background variables has basically been extended and standardized. The 2016 survey, however, used a substantially revised set of indicators. The harmonization of background variables was therefore guided by three principles:

1. to extend the background variables from v1.0.0 of the cumulated dataset where possible,
2. to introduce newly harmonized variables based on the 2016 standard when they supplemented the established indicators, and
3. to ensure that data from all five surveys is available for key demographic indicators.

All in all, the cumulated dataset contains 33 different demographic indicators (comp. 3.2.3). 18 indicators are available for all five modules, this includes data on: sex, age, marital status, education, employment situation (for respondent and spouse), household composition and religion. 12 background variables have been newly harmonized for the current version of the dataset (WORKYN/ SPWRKYN, NSUP, TYPORG2, ISCO08/ SPISCO08, SPLSLFEMP, HHKIDS, HOUSELIV, PARTY\_LR2, TOPBOT and URBRURAL).

### 3.4.4 Harmonization of occupational codes (ISCO-88 and ISCO-08)

ISCO-68 (ISSP 1990), ISCO-88 (ISSP 1996 and 2006) and ISCO-08 (ISSP 2016) have been used in the Role of Government series. To provide the broadest common code base, the available ISCO codes have been converted into both ISCO-88 and ISCO-08 for this cumulated dataset (comp. ISCO88/ SPISCO88, ISCO08/ SPISCO08). ### 3.6 Weighting

Please note, that there is **no total population weight to be used for international comparison**. While all ISSP datasets contain a weighting variable, the weights in this variable do not incorporate a common weighting scheme that can be applied to all countries of the same ISSP module.

In the Study Description/ Technical Report and/ or in the background variables documentation of each country you will find more detailed information on the kind of weights that are provided. You can see whether

- a design weight
- weights to adjust for non-response bias or
- a combination of these both weights above or
- different weighting procedures

are applied. Provision of a design weight is mandatory for countries using household-based sampling methods, as these require compensation for the lower selection probabilities of persons in larger households. ### 3.8 International documentation standard

The variable documentation is set up in accordance with the international metadata specifications for the social sciences, established by the Data Documentation Initiative <DDI>. The Variable Reports are based on the XML representation of DDI version 2. The documentation combines the wording and sequence of question components (question text, interviewer instruction, response categories, etc.) from the Basic Questionnaires with the variable description (variable name, values, and labels) of the dataset. This basic variable documentation is complemented by additional information, e.g. general notes, descriptions of harmonization steps, etc.
